#### Cozy, Safe Spaces

fter receiving training in Conscious Discipline last year, Ms. McCormick (1st grade) and Ms. Friedman (middle school) decided to create "safe spaces" in their class-rooms. Conscious Discipline is a different approach to behavior management that aims to teach students ways to self-regulate their moods and emotions. Rather than rewarding students for good behavior or punishing them for bad behavior, conscious discipline acknowledges that conflicts are a normal part of any classroom and seeks to teach students strategies to resolve them. At any time, a student, or even a teacher, may need a few minutes of quiet, private time to feel safe and ready to work. Ms. Friedman and Ms. McCormick have set up these spaces, and their students are using them almost every day. In Ms. McCormick's room, it's called the "Quiet Corner," and in Ms. Friedman's room, the students call it the "Cozy Corner." In both cases, this quiet, separate area of




